CREATIVE PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Creative Planning Committee held its first meeting Oct 5, 2011 to bring new ideas and event planning to the Board with the following results.:

New goals were set and decisions made:

1. Short term goal set as follows: raise \$15,000 to replace the financing that may be greatly decreased from the Missouri Arts Council in the form of grant monies from July 1, 2012 to July 1, 2013.
2. Long term goal: to extend our available cash flow, allowing the Lake Arts Council to maintain an office and staff, to increase the promotion of art services in the community and allow the presentation of more performing arts events.
3. A letter will be written over President Julie Lentz's signature stating the purpose and function of the Lake Arts Council in the community and our current need for financing due to the decrease of state aid. This letter will be sent to all current and past members and others whom have demonstrated an interest in the arts councils activities in the past for whom addresses are on file, such as participants in the Missoula Children's Theater.
4. The office administrator will keep a current list of all incoming donations and the Council President will weekly respond to those donors with a letter of appreciation.
5. The Lake Arts Council Members will be asked to save aluminum cans and bring them to the office. Other businesses in Stone Crest Mall will be asked to cooperate in this endeavor. The cans will be taken routinely to a redemption center for funds. This is to support our newly formed Student Art Scholarship fund.

It was a dark and stormy night...on the other side of the planet... but here in Osage Beach the sun shined brightly and everyone enjoyed the Osage Beach Fall Festival. **The Lake Writers Guild** participated in the event with a book signing by three local artists, H. Dwight Weaver, Robert Dean Anderson and Bob Mellberg. Dwight featured his latest book, *A Pictorial Guide to Ha Ha Tonka State Park*, alongside his many books about the history of the lake area. Bob Anderson's books include historical novels with a local backdrop including a trilogy concluding with *Those Farewell Blues*, and characters involved with the building of the dam; one possibly too involved. Bob Mellberg's books include *Missouri Proud*, things about Missouri worth braggin' about, and *A Grandfather's Dream Of Fair Women*, a 300 page illustrated documentary about twenty-two artist's that created the *Ideal American Girl* during the first part of the last century.

The Lake Writers Guild also had a book signing at the Versailles Applefest on October 1st with Bob Mellberg, Ethan Dempsey and Dwight Weaver participating. Ethan, a newcomer to the guild, has published two action mystery books, *13 Treasures* and *A Grain of Truth*.

Both venues provided an excellent opportunity to visit with aspiring writers and people interested in the arts. The next meeting of the Writers Guild will be on November 12, at 10 AM at the Camden County Library, 1054 Guttridge Rd, Osage beach.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF ORGAN CONCERTS PRESENTED BY THE LAKE ARTS COUNCIL

On April 13, 1996, Dorothy Kerr of the Lake Arts Council organized the first all-community Organ Concert. This was co-sponsored by the American Guild of Organists to celebrate the AGO Centennial. Our concert was one of over 150 concerts in presented in the United States and Canada. It took place at the Camdenton United Methodist Church.

The next concert, also in conjunction with the AGO called “Pipes Spectacular” was presented on October 15, 2000. It took place at Harper Chapel United Methodist Church in Osage Beach. There were seven organists and two piano/organ duets and a special arrangement of Bach's “Jesu Joy of Man's Desiring” with the Lake Strings and organ playing together.

On May 6, 2001 we had a Mini Concert at Lake Ozark Retirement Center. 4 organists and 3 pianists performed for a large enthusiastic audience.

On March 3, 2002 Harper Chapel hosted another concert. There was a variety of Piano and organ selections presenting a lively program of John Phillip Sousa's “Stars and Stripes Forever.”

Two concerts took place at the Community Christian Church in Camdenton on April 18, 2004 and April 10, 2005. A varied program consisted of organ solos, piano solos, duets, organ/piano duets, ragtime piano & organ and an organ/piano duet played by a single musician.

On April 23, 2006 again at Harper Chapel there were 14 musicians participating. A special highlight acknowledging Mozart's anniversary was presented with a piano solo by a youth who was the same age as Mozart when he composed the work.

Another concert at Harper Chapel took place on October 7, 2007. In this one, we expanded the concept and used several other instruments with either the organ or the piano. Again, we had 14 musicians participating and other instruments that were used were banjo, violin and voice.

The concert on June 28, 2009 was at Harper Chapel. We had 6 organ solos, 6 piano solos, an organ & violin duet, a piano & flute duet and a piano and banjo duo. Those attending the concert were amazed by the performances of 3 prize-winning piano students.

On Sunday, October 9, 2011 we presented our 11th concert since we began in 1996. Please see the information regarding it at the top along with the organizer, Bob Johnson who is showing us his gorgeous piano key socks. Completing his outfit, but not shown was his brilliant silver sequined vest.
